Conundrum reaches finals of the 2009 Strzelecki Awards

- Consultation with local environment groups including Land Care and Project Platypus

- Erosion repair and control
- Increasing the capacity of the onsite containment dam
- Reclamation and reduction of product stockpile areas
- A detailed weed monitoring and control program

This program has delivered the following benefits for the environment and community:

- Reduction of the site's overall footprint
- Elimination of silt run-offs and increased capacity for on-site water recycling
- Increased habitat for wildlife
- Protection of indigenous plant species
- Reduction of weed species
- Reduced soil erosion
